

Due: Friday, November 9, 2012

- 1. Using the letter formation chart you received last week have your child practice writing the letters on the back of this sheet. We are enclosing a plastic sheet protector which you may keep at home to practice letter formation. You can slip the homework page into the plastic sleeve and use a dry erase marker to practice. This will allow the page to be erased and reused several times. Use this method if you feel your child needs and is willing to do extra practice before doing a final version to turn in.
